SFMC Smoke Position paper

A revision of the SFMC Smoke Position paper received responses from 7 subject matter experts. The State Fire Management Council on the 20 March 2025 resolved to review proposed amendments to the position paper with the final position paper to be considered out of session.

Tasmanian Vegetation Fire Management Policy (TVFMP)

Thank you for your feedback into the review of the TVFMP. A report proposed six recommendations. Four focused on edits including addition of an eighth Principle, 'Regular monitoring of principles will improve performance and bring about change', with associated Strategies and Actions. Two recommendations focused on communication about, and engagement with, the Policy. The State Fire Management Council resolved to endorse these recommendations on 20 March 2025.
